




### 5 Signs of December

Sign	Picture	Signing Instructions
Snow		<p>To sign <i>snow</i>, your fingers flutter down as if they were snow flakes drifting down from the sky. Take both of hands and extend and spread your fingers. Start high and bring the hands slowly down while fluttering your fingers up and down. The sign for snow, is similar to the sign for rain, the only difference being the fluttering of the fingers.</p>
Cold		<p>To make the baby sign for cold take both hands and make them into fists with thumbs up. Pull your upper arms into your sides, extend your forearms out, and shake your fists back and fourth. The sign looks a lot like you are shivering.</p>
Santa Claus		<p>The sign for Santa Claus is based on his bushy white beard. Hold a loose "CLAW" hand to your chin. Bring it down in an arc to your chest and touch the pinkie finger side of your hand to your chest. .</p>
Tree		<p>The sign for tree looks like a tree waving above the ground. To make the tree sign, take your weak hand and extend it flat across your body to make the ground. Then take your strong hand and stand it up at right angles, with your fingers extended and shaking them back and forth.</p>
Train		<p>Point the index finger on your weak hand and make your other fingers into a fist, like a twig. Your strong hand is the leaf. Make an open hand, with palm down. Then place the base of your palm onto the index finger of your weak hand. Move your strong hand up and down a little to complete the sign.</p>
